- The Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) has announced changes for simplification of the Export Promotion Capital Goods (EPCG) scheme making it easier for exporters to comply with regulations and reducing the time and effort required to meet requirements, as per the government.
 - The Finance Ministry has slashed customs duty on lab chemicals, excluding undenatured ethyl alcohol, to 10 percent from 150 percent announced in the 2024-25 Budget.
 - Crop Life India, an association of 17 R&D-driven crop science companies, and a leading voice of the plant science industry in India, has urged the Government to discourage off-label use of Agrochemicals through implementation of crop grouping Scheme.
 - Nayara Energy, a leading refining and petrochemicals producer, has successfully dispatched its first consignment of polypropylene (PP) from its new petrochemical unit at the Vadinar refinery in Gujarat.
- Chemical distribution firm, Brenntag India, has announced the opening of its new State-of-the-Art Green Warehouse, at Sonipat (Haryana), about 50-km from central Delhi.
- A roundtable themed 'Circular Economy for Plastics – Challenges and Opportunities in India' took place on July 5 in New Delhi, marking a milestone for the upcoming 'Plastics Recycling Show India 2024, scheduled to take place from December 4-6, at NESCO in Mumbai.
 - Nandini Consultancy Centre, a chemical engineering and chemical business consultancy Organisation, based in Chennai, has released an updated publication on 90 chemical project investment opportunities
- Pune-based silicones player, Elkay Chemicals, has announced the opening of its 'Prof. Somasundaran R&D Centre for Silicone Innovations' at Bhosari, Pune.
 - The manufacturing of active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs) is a chemistry-intensive operation in which Indian companies have built significant expertise
 - Galaxy Surfactant, a leading supplier of Surfactants and Speciality Ingredients, has received the 'Great Place to Work Certification' and been ranked among 'India's Top 5 Best Workplaces in the Chemical Industry'.
 - Natural gas is widely seen as a transition fuel in the journey to more sustainable energy, especially for countries reliant on coal to meet a large portion of their energy.
 - The Supreme Court has stayed a Gujarat High Court order that reinstated anti-dumping duty on imported purified terephthalic acid (PTA) from Korea and Thailand.
 - Gujarat-based Speciality Chemicals company, Neochem Technologies Pvt. Ltd., has announced a strategic collaboration with Lamoral Coatings of The Netherlands.
 - While a few key Indian chemical firms exhibit a strong performance in comparison to their global counterparts, there is still a substantial gap in patents and publications per revenue in the Indian chemical industry, highlighting the need for increased focus on innovation and intellectual property.

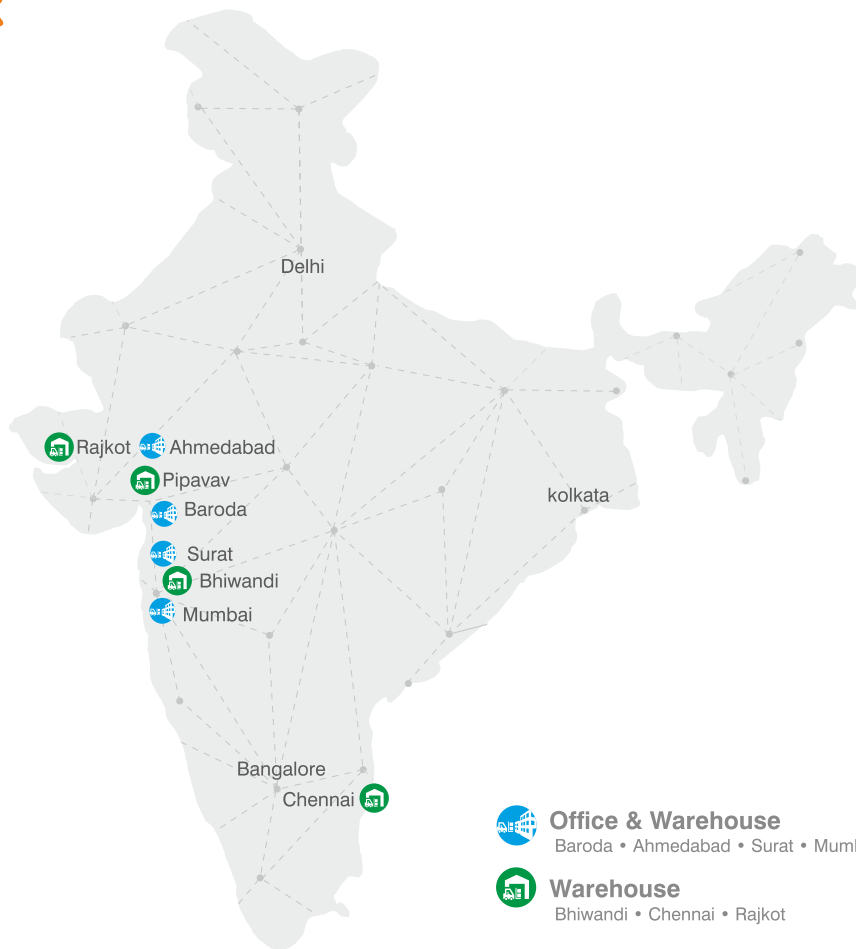
